TITLE Burial Review – Update on Recommendations

#### **OUTCOME**

To update the Scrutiny Panel on action taken in relation to the recommendations of the Burials Task and Finish Group, submitted to the Executive in 2007.

#### PROPOSED RECOMMENDATION

That the Panel notes the action taken and comments on progress made since the previous update in February 2010.

#### SUMMARY OF REPORT

- In September 2007 the Scrutiny Committee Burials Task and Finish Group submitted its report to the Executive.
- The Task and Finish Group was asked to examine 1) whether there was sufficient burial and cemetery capacity to meet future demand; and 2) whether greater provision was needed for non-traditional and non-Christian burials.
- The Executive accepted the majority of the Task and Finish Group's recommendations (set out below) and tasked the officers to report back on progress relating to their implementation.
- The most recent update was submitted to the Corporate Projects Overview and Scrutiny Panel in February 2010.
- The latest updates and supporting information will be presented to the Scrutiny Panel on 5 July 2010.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Council provision of burial facilities within the borough is not a statutory duty. However, since 1925, the Council has provided a burial service through Council owned cemeteries at St Sebastian's (Wokingham Without) and Shinfield. The analysis carried out in 2007 indicated that, based on current trends, St Sebastian's had capacity up to 2014 and Shinfield had capacity up to 2018.

The following Task and Finish Group recommendations were approved by the Executive in 2007:

- 1 That a full review be conducted of the income gained through the sale of burial rights, cost of interment, memorials, etc, to ensure that revenue goes as far as possible in meeting the ongoing maintenance costs of existing plots.
- 2 That consideration be given to the practicality of seeking planning S106 contributions from major development towards future burial provision.

- 3 That, in future planning of Council provision, consideration be given to alternative forms of burial such as Green Burial, alternative faith and non-religious burial.
- 4 That the Council actively seeks to identify a new site/sites for a cemetery and that Officers be authorized to undertake further investigations into the feasibility of sites, including the possible sites identified during the review.
- 5 That opportunities for partnership working with Town and Parish Councils on burial provision be fully explored.
- 6 That options for the use of smaller sites be investigated, in locations such as gaps and wedges in the countryside.

#### **ANALYSIS OF ISSUES**

At the meeting of the Corporate Projects Overview and Scrutiny Panel in February 2010, the following updates were provided:

- Service charges have been reviewed and revised to put the Council at the top end of the charging scale compared to neighbouring Councils.
- The potential use of S106 monies to support the development of additional burial space was being pursued as part of the Core Strategy and Strategic Development Locations work.
- An area within Shinfield cemetery was allocated for Muslim burials and a separate area was allocated for non religious burials. The allocated space was sufficient to meet demand for the foreseeable future.
- Town and Parish Councils had been approached about the potential for partnership working.
- Members requested further information on the emerging Community Infrastructure Strategy and the potential for green burials.

Updates on these issues and the other Executive recommendations will be presented to the Scrutiny Panel on 5 July 2010.
