In accordance with S18 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Wokingham Borough Council Licensing Policy, the application is referred to the Licensing and Appeals Sub Committee for determination as representations have been received.

RECOMMENDATION

The Sub Committee to determine the application to grant or refuse the application, with conditions and/or amendments as appropriate.

SUMMARY OF REPORT

To provide relevant information for the Sub Committee to consider and determine the application from W H Brakspear & Sons Limited to vary the premises licence for the Crooked Billet public house.

Background

1

The application to vary the premises licence (PR0067) for the Crooked Billet was received on 2 November 2012.

The following documentation is attached – copy of the application (Appendix One), location / layout plans (Appendix Two), copy of the current premises licence (Appendix Three) and representations (Appendix Four)

The application was checked and confirmed to be correctly made. The 28 day consultation period ran until 3 December 2012. The responsible authorities, ward members and parish council were advised of the application by email on 2 November 2012.

The application also volunteers three additional conditions to meet the licensing objectives, as detailed on page 12 of the application. In summary these are that a written risk assessment will be conducted by the designated premises supervisor (DPS) when a marquee is used, DPS or member of staff to monitor noise levels whenever there is regulated entertainment and regulated entertainment to be limited outside by hours as detailed above.

The application has been advertised correctly, with site notices displayed at the premises (checked 7 and 11 December 2012) and a notice placed in the Wokingham Times on 7 December 2012.

During the statutory consultation period of 28 days, representations were received from two local residents and the ward member for Wokingham Without.

- B Glover and G Griffiths of Trent Cottage opposed to proposed licence changes on the grounds of impact of additional noise
- Cllr Pauline Helliar-Symons opposed to application on the grounds of noise, particularly as two residents have objected

This is a variation to include the garden as part of the licensed premises. The tenant is looking for flexibility in relation to the use of the garden area and in particular to be able to sell alcohol there on occasion and have entertainment in the form of plays or musical entertainment. In addition, for example if there is a private function or other cultural event, to erect marguees in the garden.

The other part of the application is to apply for later hours, both to open earlier and sell alcohol later.

Further to my letter of Nov. 23rd, I wish to make it clear that if the licensees (present or future) use the proposed license it cannot be described as other than a public nuisance.

The Rolling Stones concert in central London this weekend was turned off - not down - at 11pm and they omitted their last song.

Why then may it be considered acceptable for me to be subjected to noise at 2am from a country pub on my boundary?

Did the application not include plans showing how close we and other neighbours are?

If this license is granted, it will have a detrimental effect on the value of this house.

If this license is used, it would affect the peaceful enjoyment of my property, affecting my family's and my well being and standard of life.

Do I not have any such rights - human or otherwise?

If we suffer from disturbance or lack of sleep, this may have a detrimental effect on the smooth running of our β ick Your Own farm (mentioned in my previous letter), established for 40 years, on which several local people depend for employment and many for food and nourishment. They at least expect and appreciate the peaceful countryside.

Of course, if the licensee (present or future) and WBC do not consider that noise at 2am so close to neighbours is a public nuisance, does that give us a right to respond likewise? They can have a lie in.

Please read my previous letter and note that we strongly object to the proposed changes to the license for live and recorded music - extended hours, extended area and

We were in correspondence over the Crooked Billet pub's application for a license a few weeks ago, and I said I would reserve judgement to depend on how the local neighbours viewed the situation, since they have to live permanently beside the public house.

I have now heard that at least two residents are opposed to it on the grounds of noise. Noise at a late hour is especially unacceptable to anyone who has to get up early every morning, such as if you are a horticultural farm owner, as one of the residents is; I believe he is one of the nearest residents to the Crooked Billet. I agree with this - it would be unreasonable for anyone to be deprived of sleep in this way., whatever their job. The Crooked Billet is located in a quiet rural lane as you know, but has several houses around it.

I am particularly concerned about the request for live and recorded music. I believe the application wants the events to be located in the pub garden. I would guess that it could be for parties or a similar event, involving quite a number of people, as well as for normal weekend customers, and therefore there would be noise over and above the music itself.

Whilte I am in sympathy with public houses doing all they can to attract customers, I am not in favour of noisy outdoor events so near to private residences, so I would therefore oppose this application. If the events were intended to remain indoors then I would have no problem.
