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# MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE LICENSING AND APPEALS COMMITTEE HELD ON TUESDAY 10 JANUARY 2012 FROM 7PM TO 7.30PM

#### 25. MINUTES

The Minutes of the meeting of the Committee held on 5 September 2011 were confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

#### 26. APOLOGIES

An apology for absence was submitted from Mike Gore.

#### 27. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

No declarations of interest were submitted.

#### 28. PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

There were no Public questions.

#### 29. MEMBER QUESTION TIME

There were no Member questions.

#### 30. HACKNEY CARRIAGE TARIFF REVIEW

Section 65 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 allows the Council to fix the rates for fares and other related charges in connection with the hire of Hackney Carriages. The Committee had agreed in March 2005 to review the taxi tariffs annually.

During the discussion of this item the following points were made:

- The Committee had last resolved to increase the tariff in May 2010. Members had agreed to adopt the drivers' preferred option to increase the flag distance, decrease the increment distance and to add the time variation.
- All 103 hackney carriage drivers and the larger operators had been written to in November 2011. They were asked whether they wished for the tariff to remain unchanged with a view to consulting again next year or if they would like an amendment, what change they would wish to see. 80 responses were received with 78 drivers asking for a change and 2 asking that the tariff remain the same. Those who had requested a change had mainly asked that the Tariff 1 minimum fare be kept at £3.00 for a journey of up to 600 yards (currently 880 yards) or part thereof and for each subsequent 126 yards or 40 seconds (currently 176 yards or 40 seconds) or part

- thereof, 20p. This would make all journeys more expensive and equated to a rise of approximately 20%.
- It was noted that currently Wokingham was ranked 65 out of 300 Councils in the Private Hire and Taxi Monthly National League Tables Averages (1 being the most expensive). Members were informed of the statistics for Slough, which had not been previously available. Slough was ranked 91 out of 300 and had a flag rate of £3, a one mile rate of £5, the highest in the country and a two mile rate of £5.80.
- The Principal Environmental Health Officer (Licensing) outlined the statutory consultation process which had to be followed once Members had made a decision regarding the increase or otherwise of the Hackney Carriage tariff.
- Whilst Members appreciated that vehicle running costs and the cost of fuel had
  increased, some had concerns that the increase requested by a number of drivers was
  too high and that drivers would lose business if prices were too high. The Chairman
  commented that the Committee had to consider both the livelihood and wellbeing of
  the drivers and the impact of any changes to the tariff on residents. A delicate balance
  had to be struck, particularly in the current economic climate.
- In response to a question from Councillor Gordon-Walker the Principal Environmental Health Officer (Licensing) commented that there were 103 Hackney Carriage Licences currently issued, that this number had stayed fairly consistent over recent years and that limiting the number of plates issued was not within the guidance.
- Councillor Loyes asked whether many complaints had been received from residents regarding the cost of taxi journeys. The Enforcement Officer (Taxis) indicated that officers had had to do little enforcement regarding overcharging and that many of the complaints received had arisen when passengers had not fully understood the different rates. In addition some passengers had made comment but not put in an official complaint. She went on to state that there was some flexibility regarding the tariff, in that drivers could agree a fee with passengers prior to undertaking their journey. However, the driver also had to put the meter on and if the meter showed a lower amount than agreed at the end of the meeting the driver had to charge the lower amount.
- Some of the Committee felt that the tariff should remain unchanged. However, the majority of Members felt that the tariff should be increased although not to the level requested. Councillor Miall suggested that initial yardage remain at 880 yards but that the subsequent yardage be reduced from 176 to 150 yards.

#### **RESOLVED** That

1) the initial yardage remain at 880 yards and that each subsequent yard be reduced from 176 to 150 yards, be agreed, subject to no objections being received during the public consultation period.
