## TITLE Update on infant to junior transfer September 2011, entry to primary 2011 and primary to secondary transfer September 2011

FOR CONSIDERATION BYSchool Admissions Forum on 14 June 2011

## SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to provide the Forum with information regarding the allocation of places for those entering infant or primary schools into Foundation Stage 2 (as a rising 5) for those children born 1 September 2006 to 31 March 2007. Full-time places were offered to start school at a single point of entry – September 2011 due to a change in legislation and parents could opt to defer their child's school place or request to start part-time.

The report also covers the two main transfer groups – those children moving from infant to junior schools and those children moving from primary to secondary schools in September 2011.

The allocation for all cohorts was made by the agreed published dates. 21 April 2011 for entry to primary, 12 April 2011 for the infant to junior transfer and the national offer date of 1 March 2011 for the primary to secondary transfer.

This is the first year where parents applied to their home local authority for all three transfer groups and co-ordination took place between local authorities.

### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

### Entry to primary:

Places were allocated in line with published arrangements but due to higher than expected numbers of applications, the decision was taken by the Children's Services Leadership Team to approach three schools to admit a limited number of children above the schools' admission number in order that the authority could meet its' statutory duty of ensuring that every Wokingham Borough child has a school place. The decision was made taking into account the high number of children who would have needed to be allocated to a school not of their parents' choice, some distance from their home address and to ensure sufficient places for late applicants.

It was predicted that there would be a high demand for places following the experience of last year; what was not known was precise numbers; the distribution of those children in the Borough or the affect of migration into the Borough on the birth data held. The areas identified as having significant pressure were the south west of the Borough, where 26 additional places were made available at Shinfield Infant & Nursery School; west Wokingham and Winnersh in particular, where 26 additional places were made available at Winnersh Primary School and Lower Earley where 20 additional places were made available at The Hawkedon Primary School. The latter two changes to be a permanent change to the admission number for this year group. The decision to allocate extra places at these three schools satisfied the ability of the authority to meet more parental preferences and to provide sufficient places for late or in-year applications. The south east area also had high demand for places.

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As last year, the tight timetable for handling applications for this cohort and modelling the impact of the proposed changes; meant that discussion with the headteachers of the schools concerned and final decisions were made during the Easter holidays. Discussions had been ongoing throughout the year with primary school area groups, following last year's emergency measures, alerting schools to the likely demand and the authority would like to record its thanks to schools and to these three schools in particular for their positive and helpful attitude in resolving the ongoing unprecedented demand.

The attached schedule gives details of the allocation and reflects the numbers of places at individual schools remaining to handle late and future in-year applications at the time of allocation.

Discussion continue to be held with each primary area to identify more permanent solutions taking into account the net capacity assessments and layouts of schools to identify schools that may be expanded in the future.

1,828 applications were received by the deadline from Wokingham Borough residents, an increase of 77 on last year. 445 expressed one preference, 396 expressed two preferences and 987 expressed three preferences. 65.5% applied online (62.5% last year).

1,556 Wokingham Borough residents received an offer of their first preferred school, 158 their second preferred school and 47 their third preferred school. 96.3% received the offer of a preferred school (98.5% last year).

A total of 67 pupils, whose parental preference could not be met, were allocated to the nearest school with places and the authority had received 26 late applications to be considered after the notification date of 21 April. The number of late applications received at the date of this report is: 62. 144 places were allocated to children living in other local authorities.

At the date of this report, there are places at: All Saint's -4; Crazies Hill - 5; Hawkedon - 1; Highwood – 4; Rivermead – 20; South Lake – 1; Winnersh - 4; Woodley CE – 9 and Shinfield Infant & Nursery – 23.

Appeal information is included in the Annual Report to the Office of the School's Adjudicator.

The parents of 59 children have indicated that they wish to defer their school place (39 to January and 20 to April) and there have been 104 requests to start their children par-time.

### Infant to Junior transfer:

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Places were allocated in line with published arrangements and there were sufficient places in the Borough at the time of allocation. Children attending the linked infant school were afforded a higher priority in the oversubscription criteria.

The attached schedule reflects the allocation and gives details of the number of places available at individual schools.

514 applications were received from Wokingham Borough residents (491 last year). 355 expressed one preference, 103 expressed two preferences and 56 expressed three preferences. 55% applied online (59% last year).

487 received an offer of their first preferred school; 15 were offered their second preferred school and 2 pupils were allocated to the third preferred school. 4 pupils were allocated to the nearest school with places as their preferred schools were full. The remainder were not allocated a school place as they are currently attending a primary school. The number of late applications received at the date of this report is: 8.

Places available at the date of this report are: Gorse Ride -3, Oaklands -2, Polehampton CE -3, Robert Piggott CE -9, Shinfield St Mary's CE Aided -15, Westende -3 and Willow Bank -4. Emmbrook and St Paul's CE are full.

Appeal information is included in the Annual Report to the Office of the School's Adjudicator.

### Primary to Secondary transfer:

Places were allocated in line with published arrangements and there were sufficient places in the Borough at the time of allocation.

1,703 applications were received from Wokingham Borough residents (1,769 last year). 346 expressed one preference, 343 expressed two preferences and 1,014 expressed three preferences. 69% applied online (48% last year).

1,339 received an offer of their first preferred school, 264 their second preferred school and 62 their third preferred school. 26 pupils were allocated to the nearest school with places as their preferred schools were full. Those requesting grammar only preferences were not allocated to an alternative school although parents were advised what schools still had places. There were 3 late applications to be considered after 1 March. The number of late applications received at the date of this report is: 37.

Places available at the date of this report are The Bulmershe – 93, The Emmbrook – 16, The Forest – 15, St Crispin's - 13 and Waingels College – 2.

Appeal information is included in the Annual Report to the Office of the School's Adjudicator

\*\*\*Whilst there were sufficient places within the Borough to accommodate all those applicants who applied by the deadline, it was agreed, following discussion with the schools, to allocate a further 20 pupils to Hawkedon Primary School and a further 26 places each to Shinfield Infant and Winnersh Primary schools to create sufficient places in the Borough to accommodate late applicants due to an exceptional demand for places. The authority will not be seeking an in-year variation to the Schools Adjudicator to change the determined admission number at Shinfield Infant School and it is the intention of the authority to reduce to the determined admission number as places are refused or as children leave this school, subject to any successful appeals.
