HEARING PROCEDURE – APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE

1. Sub-Committee to elect a Chairman for this Hearing only.
2. Chairman to welcome all Parties and introduce the Members of the Sub-Committee.
3. Chairman to ask Sub-Committee if they have any interests to declare.
4. Chairman of Sub-Committee to outline procedure and reaffirm that only information relevant to representations can be considered and that such information must be relevant to the Licensing Objectives. Chairman to confirm that all parties understand this. The four Licensing Objectives are: -
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder;
 - Public Safety;
 - The Prevention of Public Nuisance; and
 - The Protection of Children from Harm.
5. The Licensing Officer will introduce the Hearing report and update the Sub-Committee on any developments following publication of the report whenever required.
6. Applicant to present application, including any witnesses. This can last no longer than 7 minutes. Whilst this is the standard time limit given to each party to make their representation the Applicant may wish to request an extension. It will be the decision of the Sub-Committee, at the hearing, whether an extension to the time limit for making representations is given. All parties will be given equal time to put their case.
7. Responsible Authorities that have made representations and any Interested Parties that have made representations may, with the permission of the Sub-Committee, question the Applicant and witnesses.
8. Each Responsible Authority that has made representations to present their representations including any witnesses. Each Responsible Authority has 7 minutes to present their representation. Whilst this is the standard time limit given to each party to make their representation the Responsible Authority may wish to request an extension. It will be the decision of the Sub-Committee, at the hearing, whether an extension to the time limit for making representations is given. All parties will be given equal time to put their case.
9. The Applicant may ask questions of each Responsible Authority if permitted to do so by the Sub-Committee, but will, in any event, be given the opportunity to respond to comments made by other parties at the end of the Hearing.
10. Any Interested Parties that have made representations to present their representations including any witnesses. Each Interested Party has 7 minutes to present their representation. Whilst this is the standard time limit given to each party to make their representation the Interested Party may wish to request an extension. It will be the decision of the Sub-Committee, at the hearing, whether an extension to the time limit for making representations is given. All parties will be given equal time to put their case.
11. The Applicant may ask questions of each Interested Party if permitted to do so by the Sub-Committee.
12. The Sub-Committee can question any Party at any stage.
13. In order to facilitate effective Hearings, Interested Parties making similar representations will be asked to nominate a spokesman to present their representations. At the conclusion of a spokesman's representation, the Chairman will ask the other Interested Parties if they have any other points to raise.
14. Questions by the Sub-Committee and, when permitted, by the Applicant, will be directed to the nominated spokesman in the first instance.

15. The Applicant will be given the opportunity to respond to comments made.
16. After hearing the application and all representations, the Sub-Committee will ask any further questions of any party that it may have.
17. The Chairman will ask all parties if they have any further relevant points that have not been covered in the Hearing and to give a brief summary of their evidence and information with the Applicant going last in order.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To provide relevant information for the Sub Committee to consider and determine the application from Home Office Immigration Enforcement to review the premises licence PR0194 for Haweli Twyford.

OUTCOMES

In accordance with S51 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Wokingham Borough Council Licensing Policy, the application is referred to the Licensing and Appeals Sub Committee for determination as an application for a review has been received.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Sub Committee to determine the application.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

Background

Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides for a responsible authority to apply to the licensing authority for a review of a premises licence.

The representation must relate to particular premises for which a premises licence is in existence and must be relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives.

Before determining the application, the authority must hold a hearing to consider it and any relevant representations, and take steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The options open to the Sub Committee are:

- Modify the conditions of the licence (The conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added) (for a period not exceeding three months or permanently)

- Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence (for a period not exceeding three months or permanently)
- Remove the designated premises supervisor
- Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
- Revoke the licence
- Issue formal warnings to the designated premises supervisor and/or premises licence holder
- Take no action

In determining the application, the Licensing Authority has a duty to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives, which are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

For the purposes of the Licensing Act 2003, a child is an individual aged under 18.

The Licensing Authority must also have regard to the representations received, the Licensing Authority's statement of licensing policy and the statutory guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

The application for review of the premises licence PR0194 was received from Home Office Immigration Enforcement on 15 February 2018. They sent a copy to the licence holder and to the responsible authorities.

The grounds given for review are:

- We have grounds to believe the licence holder will fail to meet the licensing objective of prevention of crime and disorder as illegal working has been identified at this premises

The 28 day consultation period ran from 16 February to 15 March 2018.

The responsible authorities, ward members, parish council and licensing authority were advised of the application by email on 16 February 2018.

Site notices advertising the review application were posted at Wokingham Borough Council offices and at the premises.

Due to issues of non-display, with the site notices being removed at the premises, the consultation was restarted on 16 March 2018. The responsible authorities, ward members, parish council and licensing authority were advised of this by email.

The new consultation period ran from 16 March to 13 April 2018.

New site notices were posted at the premises and also at three locations in the vicinity of the premises. One was posted on the Twyford village sign at the junction, another on a lamp post opposite the restaurant and the third on the Twyford United Reformed Church noticeboard, with their kind permission. These were checked during the consultation period.

During the statutory consultation period, the following responses were received:

- Thames Valley Police response – “no representation, no recorded incidents against these premises”
- Trading Standards response – “no comments”
- Environmental Health response – “no comments”
- Health & Safety – “This premise received a full hygiene inspection on 06/02/2018 in the presence of the Food Business Operator, Mr. Raj. Sattar. Hygiene standards were found to be generally satisfactory and the business received a national food hygiene rating of 4. Mr. Sattar was asked to forward evidence of gas equipment safety inspections (not yet received)
- Children and Young People’s Services – no response received
- Planning - no response received
- Fire authority – no response received
- Public Health – no response received

Following the application for review, on 20 February 2018 the licensing authority was contacted by Mr Muhammad Sattar of trading name Wavemax Limited. Transfer and DPS application forms were sent on request and on 8 March 2018 the licensing authority received applications to transfer the licence holder and DPS from Mr Mainul Islam to Mr Harun Miah. Home Office Immigration Enforcement objected to the transfer on 20 March 2018. There is a separate hearing on 19 April 2018 to determine this objection, it is not the subject of this review application hearing.

The licence holder’s legal representative has been invited to make any submission they may wish in response, this will be circulated to all parties prior to the hearing if received.

Licensing Lawyers of Wallingford have been instructed to represent the licence holder Mr Harun Miah and restaurant manager Mr Muhammad Sattar.

We have grounds to believe the license holder will fail to meet the licensing objectives of prevention of crime and disorder, as illegal working has been identified at this premises.

Section 36 and Schedule 4 of the Immigration Act 2016 (the 2016 Act) amended the Licensing Act 2003 (the 2003 Act) to introduce immigration safeguards in respect of licensing applications made in England and Wales on or after 6 April 2017. The intention is to prevent illegal working in premises licensed for the sale of alcohol or late night refreshment.

The Home Secretary (in practice Home Office (Immigration Enforcement)) was added to the list of Responsible Authorities (RA) in the licensing regime, which requires Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) to receive premises licence applications (except regulated entertainment only licences and applications to vary a Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS)), and in some limited circumstances personal licence applications. In carrying out the role of responsible authority, Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) is permitted to make relevant representations and objections to the grant of a licence or request a review of an existing licence as a responsible authority where there is concern that a licence and related licensable activity is prejudicial to the prevention of immigration crime including illegal working.

Please provide as much information as possible to support the application (please read guidance note 3)

On 03/02/2014 an enforcement visit was conducted. A warrant was executed and entry gained by officers via front door.

Nine males encountered. One Asian male ran from the premises and evaded officers. One Indian male was cleared and one Indian male was escorted off of the premises as he had no right to work. Two British males were cleared and allowed to return to work. Three Bangladeshi males were cleared and allowed to return to work. One British male- the manager arrived on the premises and was cleared. One Bangladeshi male was arrested as a person liable to be detained and served papers as an illegal entrant- entry without leave. One Bangladeshi male was arrested as a person liable to be detained and served papers as an overstayer.

Notice Of Potential Liability was served.

A penalty of £10,000 was issued on 25/03/14 to Haweli Twyford Ltd. No objection was received. The case is appeal rights exhausted. There is currently £4,000 outstanding on this penalty. The penalty was being paid in instalments but the payments stopped August 2016.

An enforcement visit was conducted 06/01/2017 and the warrant was executed at 19.55hrs. It was a very busy restaurant, with at least 10 customers waiting to be seated as officers entered. Three front of house staff including the owner, Raju Miah were permitted to carry on serving customers whilst the remainder of the staff were brought to a sterile area in the Shisha Lounge at the rear of the premises.

There were 11 members of staff in total. Mr. Miah was not happy with staff being questioned in this part of the restaurant and so officers escorted staff to upstairs accommodation to be questioned. An Immigration Officer then took details of the staff left at front of house, 2 x British nationals and 1 x Bangladeshi with Indefinite Leave to Remain . Two other staff members later entered premises, 1x British national and 1 x Pakistani with leave as Tier 1, all cleared. The other staff that were cleared to carry on working were 1 xBritish national , 1x Romanian, and 1 x Bangladeshi with 3C leave.

There were four males found to be illegally working. One male was not a suitable case for detention. The other three males 2 x Bangladeshi's and 1 x Indian were arrested and respectively and detained. Referral Notice served to Miah with 4 names on it. Codes of practice also served.

All officers and detainees leave premises at 21.23hrs.

A civil penalty for £80,000 was raised which is outstanding.

On 08/08/2017 Haweli Twyford was visited at 13:14. Entry was under Section 179 of the Licensing Act 2003 due to an alcohol licence being held by the business.

Two males were located at the front of the premises and a further three were in the kitchen area. The Notice to occupier form was served prior to the search on one of the males at the front, he later identified himself as Azizur Rahman. He admitted to working at the premises and was listed as an absconder. He was detained and placed on the referral notice. The second male at the front of the premises, who had been behind the bar admitted working without the right to work and due to an outstanding application he was granted Temporary Release.

One male located in the kitchen was cleared as a Bulgarian national. An Indian male was located in the kitchen and admitted working at the premises. He was identified as an absconder and was detained. A fifth employee was located in the kitchen and admitted working without permission.

He had an outstanding application and was reporting to Becket House and so was escorted from the premises.

Due to four of the five employees not having permission to work the referral notice was served by Recorded delivery for attention of the business owner. The Notice to occupier was left in a prominent place on the counter. The one Bulgarian national remained at the premises once officers had left.

Referral notice served on Owner/manager by recorded delivery.

A civil penalty for £60,000 was raised which is outstanding.



**Annex 1
Mandatory Conditions**

Mandatory Condition - supply of alcohol

- 1) that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended: and
- 2) that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

Notification of change of name or address

(1) The holder of a premises licence must, as soon as is reasonably practicable, notify the relevant licensing authority of any change in -

- (a) name and address
- (b) unless the designated premises supervisor has already notified the authority under subsection (4), the name and address of that supervisor

(2) a notice under (1) must be accompanied by the premises licence (or the appropriate part of the licence) or, if that is not practical, by a statement of the reasons of for the failure to produce the licence (or part).

(3) where the designated premises supervisor under a premises licence is not the holder of the licence, he may notify the relevant licensing authority of any change in his name and address

**Annex 2
Embedded Restrictions**

Embedded Restrictions carried over from Licensing Act 1964 - copy attached

with additional conditions:

Intoxicating liquor shall not be sold on the premises otherwise than to persons taking table meals there and for consumption by such a person as an ancillary to his meal

Suitable beverages, other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be equally available for consumption with, or otherwise, as an ancillary to meals served in the licensed premises

plus conditions subject to which existing licence(s) has been granted:

a) General

Staff carefully supervised.

b) Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Alarms installed
Premises properly run.

c) Public Safety

Careful watch kept. Police advised of any problems.

d) Prevention of Public Nuisance

Children under 18 must be accompanied by adults and children are watched by staff.

e) Protection of Children from Harm

Children must be accompanied by adults.
