

PURPOSE OF REPORT (Inc Strategic Outcomes)

This Report summarises the amendments required under Amendment no.4 of the Wokingham Borough-wide Traffic Regulation Consolidation Order 2017 for On-Street Parking Restrictions to meet statutory requirements for securing secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians).

Following the creation of the Consolidation Order there is a need for further changes to restrictions to resolve safety, congestion or amenity needs raised by members and residents, such as on-street parking impacts or unsafe parking behaviours.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Executive Member for Highways and Transport:

- approves the transition of statutory processes required to enable the proposals in Amendment no.4 Schedule A of this report to be implemented on roads within the Borough; and
- instructs officers to revise the proposals for streets listed in Schedule B of this report and undertake further consultation as necessary amongst affected residents;
- 3) further instructs officers to bring forward relevant parking controls in respect of those roads deferred at this time in a future Amendment
- 4) authorises officers to write to respondents to advise them of the outcome of this IEMD.

SUMMARY OF REPORT

The proposals for implementation of new on-street waiting and loading restrictions, amendments to existing restrictions on existing roads and the creation of parking controls on new roads yet to come into operation are made for one, some or all of the following purposes in each case;

- a) for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road to which the order relates or any other road, or
- b) for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or
- c) for preventing damage to the road or buildings on or near it, or
- d) for facilitating the passage of vehicular traffic on the road, or
- e) for preserving or improving the amenities of an area by prohibiting or restricting the use on a road or roads in that area of heavy commercial vehicles.

Proposals for restrictions in these streets were published as appropriate in or more of the following; an advertisement in a local newspaper, on-site at the locus of proposals and on the Council's website for a period not less than 21-days. No objections were received from residents in the streets listed in Schedule A, with the following exceptions:

- Millers Grove, Woodley
- Whitegates Lane, Earley

The objections received have been reviewed by an officer and it is their recommendation that the proposals should proceed. For data protection reasons these objections cannot be published in this report, but each objection will be considered by the Executive Member at this meeting before any of the proposals in these roads are progressed further.

As a result of an overwhelming number of objections to proposals in the following streets being received, it is the officers' recommended that current proposals are abandoned and that officers amend the proposals, taking into consideration the issues raised by residents and that a revised proposal forms part of a future Amendment Order.

Proposals for the following new roads yet to be constructed/completed, have been deferred until they have been adopted by the Council as public highway;

Wokingham Borough Council ("the Council") in exercise of the power conferred by Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act of 1984"), as amended and all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 hereby makes the following Order:

1. <u>Citation and commencement</u>

This Order shall come into operation on ****** and may be cited as the Wokingham Borough Council (Various Roads, Wokingham Borough) (Stopping, Waiting, Loading and Unloading Prohibitions and Restrictions, Parking Places and Resident Permit Parking Places) (Civil Parking Enforcement) (Consolidation) Order 2017 (Amendment No. 4) Order 2021.

2. Interpretation

In this Order, **"the Order of 2017"** means the Wokingham Borough Council (Various Roads, Wokingham Borough) (Stopping, Waiting, Loading and Unloading Prohibitions and Restrictions, Parking Places and Resident Permit Parking Places) (Civil Parking Enforcement) (Consolidation) Order 2017.

3. Amendment to the Order of 2017

Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred by the coming into operation of this Order, the Order of 2017, as amended, shall have affect as though, as for the map tiles specified in column 2 of Schedule 1 to the Order of 2017 are hereby replaced by the map tiles similarly numbered as specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order below.

4. Save as varied herein, the restrictions imposed by this Order shall be supplemental to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by the Order of 2017 and any regulations made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

Wokingham Borough Council (Various Roads, Wokingham Borough) (Stopping, Waiting, Loading and Unloading Prohibitions and Restrictions, Parking Places and Resident Permit Parking Places) (Civil Parking Enforcement) (Consolidation) Order 2017 (Amendment No. 4) Order 2021.

A number of road safety concerns have been raised by ward members and local residents in regard to problems caused by drivers parking at junctions, reducing visibility of and for exiting vehicles and in other locations, such as on bends.

The Order imposed waiting restrictions at the locations below to prevent parking and improve road safety. Changes are also proposed to aid traffic flows and improve congested roads at peak times. Changes to restrictions are also proposed in relation to new developments and new roads.

Reviews of existing restrictions have shown that there are some inconsistencies between Orders and restrictions indicated on the ground and these anomalies are being resolved by remaking the Orders.

This Order imposes waiting restrictions operational 'at any time' on a length or lengths of: Anderson Avenue Earley, Ardwell Close Crowthorne, Blackthorn Close Earley, Byron Road Earley, Culver Lane, Dalley Road Wokingham, Elgar Avenue Crowthorne, Ellis Road Crowthorne, Emerald Close Woosehill, Erleigh Court Gardens Earley, Fairview Road Wokingham, Gipsy Lane Wokingham, Grange Avenue Crowthorne, Hilary Drive Crowthorne, Hilmanton Earley, Leisure Road Woodley, Loddon Bridge Road Woodley, Millers Grove Woodley, Milton Road Woodley, Nightingale Road Woodley, Northway Wokingham, Purcel Road Crowthorne, Ravenswood Avenue Crowthorne, Rushey Way Earley, Whitegates Lane.

EXPLANTORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order makes changes to the Wokingham Borough Council (Various Roads, Wokingham Borough) (Stopping, Waiting, Loading and Unloading Prohibitions and Restrictions, Parking Places and Resident Permit Parking Places) (Civil Parking Enforcement) (Consolidation) Order 2017 on street parking provisions in the Borough Wokingham at certain locations by replacing and / or adding versions of certain map tiles to the Order of 2017, by imposing the following provisions and restrictions: -
