School	Published Admission Number	Allocation detail – statement for appeal purposes
Aldryngton Primary	45	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under oversubscription criteria A to C and 32 under criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.317 miles from the school according to the computerised mapping system used by the council's School Admissions Team. There were insufficient places for the remaining 85 children (9 in criterion D, 1 in criterion E and 75 in criterion F). These applicants have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. The local authority will advise an appeals panel that the admission of further children would prejudice future infant class size.
All Saints CE (Aided) Primary	45*	The Governing Body considered and ranked all the applications received. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination. 11 children are allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is the designated area school or the most accessible school with places. Places in the resource will be allocated by the Special Educational Needs Team.
Bearwood Primary	40	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated place at the school following co-ordination. 2 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is either the designated area or the most accessible school with places.
Beechwood Primary	45	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 18 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.734 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 9 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. The local authority will advise an appeals panel that the admission of further children would cause future infant class size prejudice.
Colleton Primary, The	60	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated place at the school following co-ordination. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size when the school reaches its admission number.
Coombes CE Primary, The	75	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 23 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 3.045 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 13 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. The local authority will advise an appeals panel that the admission of further children would prejudice future infant class size.
Crazies Hill CE Primary	15	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 2 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.916 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 5 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. The local authority will advise an appeals panel that the admission of further children would prejudice future infant class size.
Earley St Peter's CE (Aided) Primary	70	The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline and, following co-ordination, could make offers to all those applicants meeting criteria 1 to 5 and 20 children in criterion 6. The last child offered under criterion 6 lived 1.356 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places to meet all parental preferences under criterion 6 and one child has been provisionally placed on the waiting list pending confirmation from the parents that they wish their child to remain on the waiting list for the school. No children were ranked in criteria 7 to 10.
Emmbrook Infant	60	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under oversubscription criteria A to D and 11 under criterion E. The last child allocated under criterion E lived 1.484 miles from the school according to the computerised mapping system used by the council's School Admissions Team. There were insufficient places for the remaining 25 children (3 in criterion E and 22 in criterion F). These applicants have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.

Ewendons Primary	50	Ewendons Primary School commissioned Wokingham Borough Council to rank its applications in accordance with the school's admission policy and the ranked list was checked and ratified by the Governing Body. Following co-ordination offers could be made to all those applicants meeting criteria A to D and 37 children in criterion E. The last child offered under criterion E lived 0.866 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 33 children (19 in criterion E, 1 in criterion F and 13 in criterion G) and these children have been provisionally placed on the waiting list pending confirmation from the parents that they wish their child to remain on the waiting list for the school.
Farley Hill Primary	30	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 6 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 2.897 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 9 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Finchampstead CE Aided Primary	17	The Governing Body considered all applications received by the deadline and, after co-ordination, offers could be made to all those applications meeting criteria 1 to 9 and one child in criterion 10. The child offered under criterion 10 lived 0.618 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places to meet all parental preferences under criteria 10. 5 children are provisionally placed on the waiting list of the school.
Gorse Ride Infant	60	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated place at the school following co-ordination. 15 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is either the designated area or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size when the school reaches its admission number.
Grazeley Parochial CE Aided Primary	15 Number allocated 30	It was agreed, by the Governing Body, to allocate a further 15 pupils to create sufficient places in the Borough as part of a permanent expansion of the school. The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. All applicants in criteria 1 to 4 who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination. There were insufficient places for the remaining 10 children in criteria 5 and 6 who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would cause infant class size prejudice.
Hatch Ride Primary	30	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 5 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 1.187 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 8 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Hawkedon Primary	90	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to C plus 51 in criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.927 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 36 children (2 in criterion D, 8 in criterion E and 26 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Hawthorns Primary, The	60	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 2 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.357 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 15 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.

Highwood Primary	30*	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 5 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.719 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 4 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Hillside Primary	60	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 8 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.433 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 24 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Keep Hatch Primary	60	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to D plus 3 in criterion E. The last child allocated under criterion E lived 1.724 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 12 children (1 in criterion E and 11 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Lambs Lane Primary	30*	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to C plus 12 in criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 1.142 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 19 children (8 in criterion D; 5 in criterion E and 6 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Loddon Primary	60	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.470 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 26 children (3 in criterion E and 23 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Nine Mile Ride Primary	50	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 16 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 2.250 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining child in criterion F who has been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school.
Oaklands Infant	60	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated place at the school following co-ordination. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size when the school reaches its admission number.
Piggott School (The) (Charvil Primary School)	30	The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. Following co-ordination, all applicants in criteria A to F and 3 in criterion G who expressed a preference, and where no higher preference could be offered, were allocated places. The last child allocated under criterion G lived 1.005 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 4 children in criterion G who have been provisionally placed on the waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.

Polehampton CE Infant	60	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated place at the school following co-ordination. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size when the school reaches its admission number.
Radstock Primary	60	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to C plus 32 in criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.403 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 65 children (6 in criterion D; 3 in criterion E and 56 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Rivermead Primary	60	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 7 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.648 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 10 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Robert Piggott CE Infant	45	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 16 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 2.250 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining child in criterion F who has been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. The local authority will advise an appeals panel that the admission of further children would prejudice future infant class size.
Shinfield Infant & Nursery	60 Number allocated 90	To ensure sufficient places within the Borough to accommodate all those applicants who applied by the deadline, it was agreed, following discussion with the school and as part of a permanent expansion of the school, to allocate a further 30 pupils. This increase enabled the authority to fully allocate the school with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 8 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 1.217 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 16 children in criterion F who has been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Sonning CE Aided Primary	30	The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination and 1 child has been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is either the designated area or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size when the school reaches its admission number.
South Lake Primary	60	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to C plus 38 in criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.434 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 41 children (5 in criterion D; 6 in criterion E and 30 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
St Dominic Savio Catholic Primary	60	The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination. 26 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is the most accessible school with places. Admission of further pupils would cause infant class size prejudice when the admission number is reached.
St Nicholas CE Primary	20	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated place at the school following co-ordination. The school was fully allocated. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.

St Sebastian's CE Aided Primary	24	The Governing Body considered and ranked all applications received by the deadline in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria. All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher preference could be offered were allocated places after co-ordination.
St Teresa's Catholic Primary	45	There were no applicants under Category 1. The Admissions Committee allocated 45 places in accordance with the admissions policy where no higher preference could be offered, 23 under Category 2, 21 under Category 3 and 1 in Category 4. After co-ordination, the last child allocated came from Category 4 living 2.723 miles from the school. There were insufficient places for the remaining 15 children (2 under Category 4; 2 under Category 5; 2 under Category 7 and 9 under Category 11). These children have been provisionally placed on the waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the wait list for this school. Admission of further pupils would cause future infant class size prejudice.
Walter Infant	90	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to D plus 1 in criterion E. The last child allocated under criterion E lived 0.412 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 26 children (7 in criterion E and 19 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Wescott Infant	56*	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to C plus 32 in criterion D. The last child allocated under criterion D lived 0.902 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 27 children (1 in criterion D; 1 in criterion E and 25 in criterion F) who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. There is potential that admission of further pupils would prejudice infant class size after allocating 2 children to the resource by the SEN team should more than 2 appeals for the school be upheld.
Wheatfield Primary	30	Wheatfield Primary School commissioned Wokingham Borough Council to rank its applications in accordance with the school's admission policy and the ranked list was checked and ratified by the Academy Trust Board. Following co-ordination offers could be made to all those applicants who expressed a preference for the school. 4 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is either the designated area or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further pupils would cause infant class size prejudice when the admission number is reached.
Whiteknights Primary	60	All applicants who expressed a preference and where no higher ranked preference could be offered were allocated place at the school following co-ordination. The school was fully allocated. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Willow Bank Infant	60	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 7 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 0.685 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 13 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Windmill Primary	30	Windmill Primary School commissioned Wokingham Borough Council to rank its applications in accordance with the school's admission policy and the ranked list was checked and ratified by the Academy Trust Board. Following co-ordination offers could be made to all those applicants who expressed a preference for the school. One child has been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is either the designated area or the most accessible school with places. Admission of further pupils would cause infant class size prejudice when the admission number is reached.

Winnersh Primary	60	The school was fully allocated with applicants expressing a preference for the school. 10 children have been allocated for whom no higher ranked preference could be offered as this is either the designated area or the most accessible school with places.. Admission of further children would prejudice infant class size.
Woodley CE Primary	45	The school was fully allocated with applicants who qualified under criteria A to E plus 5 in criterion F. The last child allocated under criterion F lived 1.215 miles from the school according to the local authority's computerised mapping system. There were insufficient places for the remaining 6 children in criterion F who have been provisionally placed on a waiting list pending confirmation from parents that they wish to remain on the waiting list for the school. The local authority will advise an appeals panel that the admission of further children would prejudice future infant class size.

Please note that for those shaded schools, places have been allocated by the governing body of the school as they are their own admissions authority and places were allocated according to their oversubscription criteria detailed in the Parent's Guide to Primary School Admissions, on school websites or at: www.wokingham.gov.uk/admissions.

KEY TO HOW PLACES WERE ALLOCATED IN COMMUNITY AND VOLUNTARY CONTROLLED SCHOOLS

The following oversubscription criteria, in order of priority, were applied when a community or voluntary controlled school received more preferences than places available:

- A 'Looked after' children or children who were 'looked after', but ceased to be so because they were adopted or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order (previous 'looked-after' children)
- B Children who have exceptional medical or social needs as the grounds for their admission to a particular school
- C Children whose permanent home address is **inside** the schools' designated area and who has a sibling at the school at the time of application; who is expected to be attending the school when the child will enter the school.
- D Children whose permanent home address is in the school's designated area
- E Children whose permanent home address is **outside** the schools' designated area and who has a sibling at the school at the time of application; who is expected to be attending the school when the child will enter the school.
- F Any other children

For both community and voluntary controlled schools - all children with statements of special educational needs or an Education, Health and Care Plan that named a school in the statement or plan were admitted to the school that was named

If the school does not have sufficient places for children in any category, places will then be allocated on the basis of the radial distance using the local authority's computerised mapping system and the distance will be measured as a straight line between the Land and Property Gazetteer address points for the respective home address and school.
